How does it work?

Your care will be pre-planned with a home care agency and a support package for a carer to visit at set times, for a certain length of time will be arranged. A carer will visit you in your home and they will provide you with a list of the times they will visit and how they will support you.

A carer moves into your house to support you. They usually work 24/7 for a certain period of time, before taking a break, when another carer takes over. You will need to accommodate the live in carer, therefore a spare room will be required.

It enables couples to stay together and provides constant companionship.

You move into the care home and an on-site team support you with all your care and support needs 24/7.

A call bell system is always available if you need someone to support you.

The environment is secure and continuously monitored for your safety.

How much does it cost?

Care at home is charged based on the time of the call. Prices vary depending on the area, but you should expect to pay between £20 to £30 per hour. The rate may be more at weekends and bank holidays.

As an example: If you need home care two hours a day at a rate of £25 per hour, the weekly cost would be £350.

Generally, live in care fees start at around £800 to £1,400 per week.

The cost of live in care varies depending on your needs, what services you require and what provider you choose.

Care home costs vary depending on the area and the level of care required.

For example, low dependency residential care could be anything from £800 - £1500 per week. Expect to pay more for higher dependency and nursing care.

What is included in the fees?

The cost of the care being provided at times and durations agreed.

Care, companionship and support 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

What's included in your fee, and the fee itself will depend of your individual wishes and support needs

Care and support 24 hours a day seven days a week, no household bills or maintenance costs, laundry, housekeeping services, all meals, snacks and drinks.

The opportunity to meet new friends and interact with different people.

Daily activities are arranged by the onsite care and activities team.
